Dear Child Care Provider,

This letter is in regards to the November 5, 2015 compliance check of your Level B, Registered Child Development Home. Iowa Code Chapter 237A and 441 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 110, describes specific requirements that must be met by a Registered Child Development Home. The following areas were out of compliance at the time of my visit:

FINDINGS: *Identify FINDINGS in each area of non-compliance.*

- 441 IAC 110.5(1)"a" All travel vehicles must have a paper copy of emergency parent contact information

Please make a copy of your posted emergency contacts and keep one in the glove compartment or console of your vehicle. If you find it easier, you may also use the sheet on page 29 of the packet of forms provided to you at the time of the spot check.

- 441 IAC 110.5(1)"c" A first-aid kit shall be available and easily accessible whenever children are in the child development home, in the outdoor play area, in vehicles used to transport children, and on field trips. The kit shall be sufficient to address first aid related to minor injury or trauma and shall be stored in an area inaccessible to children. The kit shall, at a minimum, include adhesive bandages, antiseptic cleaning materials, disposable tweezers, and disposable plastic gloves.

Please note the updated requirements regarding contents, particularly gloves and ointment.

- 441 IAC 110.5(1)"e" All accessible electrical outlets shall be tamper-resistant outlets or shall be safely capped.

Please double check all outlets.

- 441 IAC 110.5(1)"f" Combustible materials shall be kept a minimum of three feet away from furnaces, stoves, water heaters, and gas dryers

Please move the tubes and items surrounding so there is an adequate amount of space.

441 IAC 110.5(1)“k” Fire and tornado drills shall be practiced monthly and the provider shall keep documentation evidencing compliance with monthly practice on file

Please make sure you are tracking this monthly. You can use the form on page7 as an easy way to document. I suggest keeping this form in a visible location such as a refrigerator or cabinet as an easy reminder.

441 IAC 110.5(1)“s” If children are allowed to use an aboveground or in-ground swimming pool:
(1) Written permission from parents shall be available for review.

Make sure to have written permission on file during pool season.

441 IAC 110.5(8) Children’s Files. An individual file is maintained for each child and updated annually or when there are changes. Each file contains:

441 IAC 110.5(8) “e”. A statement of health condition signed by a physician or designee submitted annually from the date of the admission physical. For a child who is five years of age or older and enrolled in school, a statement of health status signed by the parent or legal guardian may be substituted for the physician statement.

Request from parents.

441 IAC 110.5(8) “h”. For each school-age child, on the first day of attendance, documentation of a physical examination that was completed at the time of school enrollment or since.

Request from parents.

Non-compliance with any of the mandated regulatory requirements listed above may lead to the cancellation or revocation of your Child Development Home Registration. **Please take whatever steps are necessary to completely address each of the violations noted above. It is essential you correct all above-mentioned violations.**

Based on the items out of compliance listed above, you will be required to have a recheck or follow up visit to your home. This visit will occur on/or after ____

x Based on the items out of compliance listed above, a recheck or follow up visit to your home is not necessary. However, it is essential you provide documentation to the Department that certifies you have corrected each of the identified regulatory violations and are now in complete compliance with all Departmental regulatory mandates. **Please check mark each of the boxes listed above when the necessary corrections have been completed.
