Tobacco-Free/Nicotine-Free Policy guidelines for use with Rodeos

Policy:

Tobacco and nicotine use, including but not limited to cigarettes, cigars, chewing tobacco, snuff, vape, pipes, snus, Electronic Smoking Devices (ESD), and nicotine products that are not Food and Drug Administration (FDA) approved for tobacco cessation, is prohibited on all rodeo grounds at all times for the duration of the rodeo. No person shall use any form of tobacco, nicotine, vape, or ESD product at or on any facility/grounds of which the rodeo is taking place. This tobacco/nicotine/ESD policy applies to all employees, volunteers, independent contractors, and members of the general public while attending the rodeo.

Enforcement:

Effective Date:

- a) Appropriate signs shall be posted in appropriate areas.
- b) The community, especially facility users and staff, will be notified about this policy.
- c) Staff will make periodic observations of facilities to monitor for compliance.
- **d)** Any person found violating this policy will be asked to refrain from tobacco, nicotine, vape, or ESD use or risk immediate ejection from the event grounds for the remainder of the event.
- e) If the violator refuses to leave, the staff may contact local authorities.

This policy statement is effective immediately upon the date of adoption.	
Appropriate Official	Date
To ensure the rodeo has a strong toba clings and outdoor signage, the policy mu	st explicitly include all of the following:

- ✓ Policy must include 100% tobacco-free/nicotine-free grounds, at all times
- ✓ Policy must extend to all types of tobacco, nicotine, vape, and ESD products (i.e. not only cigarettes; include all tobacco, ESDs, and nicotine products not approved by the FDA for cessation.)
- ✓ There should not be any designated smoking/tobacco use areas
- ✓ Policy must include persons responsible for enforcement
