An individual is considered to be lawfully residing in the United States if he or she is lawfully present and otherwise meets the eligibility requirements in the state plan.

An individual is considered to be lawfully present in the United States if he or she:

- 1. Is a qualified non-citizen as defined in 8 U.S.C. 1641(b) and (c);
- Is a non-citizen in a valid nonimmigrant status, as defined in 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(15) or otherwise under the immigration laws (as defined in 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(17));
- 3. Is a non-citizen who has been paroled into the United States in accordance with 8 U.S.C. 1182(d)(5) for less than 1 year, except for an individual paroled for prosecution, for deferred inspection or pending removal proceedings;
- 4. Is a non-citizen who belongs to one of the following classes:
  - Granted temporary resident status in accordance with 8 U.S.C. 1160 or 1255a, respectively;
  - Granted Temporary Protected Status (TPS) in accordance with 8 U.S.C. §1254a, and individuals with pending applications for TPS who have been granted employment authorization;
  - Granted employment authorization under 8 CFR 274a.12(c);
  - Family Unity beneficiaries in accordance with section 301 of Pub. L. 101-649, as amended;
  - Under Deferred Enforced Departure (DED) in accordance with a decision made by the President;
  - Granted Deferred Action status;
  - Granted an administrative stay of removal under 8 CFR 241;
  - Beneficiary of approved visa petition who has a pending application for adjustment of status;
- 5. Is an individual with a pending application for asylum under 8 U.S.C. 1158, or for withholding of removal under 8 U.S.C.1231, or under the Convention Against Torture who -
  - Has been granted employment authorization; or
  - Is under the age of 14 and has had an application pending for at least 180 days;

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6. Has been granted withholding of removal under the Convention Against Torture; 7. Is a child who has a pending application for Special Immigrant Juvenile status as described in 8 U.S.C. 1101(a)(27)(J); 8. Is lawfully present in American Samoa under the immigration laws of American Samoa; or 9. Is a victim of severe trafficking in persons, in accordance with the Victims of Trafficking and Violence Protection Act of 2000, Pub. L. 106-386, as amended (22 U.S.C. 7105(b)); 10. Exception: An individual with deferred action under the Department of Homeland Security's deferred action for the childhood arrivals process, as described in the Secretary of Homeland Security's June 15, 2012 memorandum, shall not be considered to be lawfully present with respect to any of the above categories in paragraphs (1) through (9) of this definition. Other The state assures that it provides limited Medicaid services for treatment of an emergency medical condition, not related to an organ transplant procedure, as defined in 1903(v)(3) of the SSA and implemented at 42 CFR 440.255, to the following individuals who meet all Medicaid eligibility requirements, except documentation of citizenship or satisfactory immigration status and/or present an SSN: Qualified non-citizens subject to the 5 year waiting period described in 8 U.S.C. 1613; Non-qualified non-citizens, unless covered as a lawfully residing child or pregnant woman by the state under the option in accordance with 1903(v)(4) and implemented at 435.406(b).
