



On Monday (10/07/13) the mother called Head Start to report the child was not coming because she was sick and she was asked about the meeting. She replied that she forgot about it. Staff members asked her if she still wanted the meeting and she said no. Ms. Onsager and Ms. Kruger state the mother never mentioned what the meeting was about.

Ms. Onsager states they do not have a child in their classroom with the name of the child being accused of placing the toy in the child victim. They report when they are outside on the playground they are also outside with the Kessel Kids children, so there are up to nine staff members outside at one time. There are no areas where children could possibly go and not be seen. Ms. Onsager and Ms. Kruger states the child in question only plays with the Head Start children and staff members move around the area constantly.

Ms. Onsager and Ms. Kruger state the child still attends the program. The mother brought the child in on 10/08/13 and said the child needed to take medication so she was going to come back at noon to give it to the child. The mother never showed up. Ms. Kruger attempted to contact the mother, but could not get in touch with her. The mother and father came to pick the child up at the end of the day and Ms. Kruger asked the father if the child still needed the medication from noon and the father responded as though he did not know the child needed medication. The mother said she forgot to come in at noon.

On 10/09/13 the mother dropped the child off and staff members asked her if the child still needed the medication. The mother said the medication made the child hyper at night so she was going to call the doctor to get new medication. The mother never mentioned anything more about it.

Ms. Onsager and Ms. Kruger state they do not believe this occurred at their program. The child has not displayed any inappropriate behaviors and they do not feel with the number of staff members supervising the children in the room or outside that there would have been an opportunity for this to occur.


I observed the playground area and the area is fairly open and there does not appear to be any hidden areas where this could have occurred without being noticed by staff members.

**Special Notes and Action Required:**

109.10 (16). Supervision. Assigned staff, substitutes and volunteers shall provide careful supervision. NOT VIOLATED. There is no evidence to support the allegations at this time. There was no physical evidence that the incident occurred and staff members state this incident did not occur at the program.
