WIN!: Specialists & providers submit cancer data to the Iowa Cancer Registry via the Iowa Health Information Network (IHIN) using Secure File Transfer.

Who: Urologists, Dermatologists & providers who diagnose and/or treat cancer patients

When: Meaningful Use Stage 2 reporting period and ongoing

Where: Across Iowa

Why: Since 1982, cancer has been a reportable disease in Iowa, and the State Health Registry of Iowa/Iowa Cancer Registry at the University of Iowa has been delegated the responsibility for collecting data on cancer. To meet Stage 2 Meaningful Use Menu Objectives, all eligible professionals can report data to the State Cancer Registry electronically through the IHIN.

What:

- The State Health Registry of Iowa/Iowa Cancer Registry is working with Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) and the IHIN to move forward with the objectives of Stage 2 Meaningful Use in Iowa.
