Called to Order at 7:30 a.m.

Roll call of CAC members, staff from ***hawk-i*** Policy, Telligen, Delta, and UnitedHealthcare. A quorum was met. Approval of minutes from April 16, 2015, and October 15, 2015, with no changes required.

Mary Greene, Addie Rasmusson, and Sarah mauch from the Iowa Department of Public Health (IDPH) presented an overview of the Adolescent and young Adult Health Collaboration Innovation Improvement Network (CoIIN), of which Iowa is working with team members from Texas, Vermont, New Hampshire, New Mexico, and Mississippi in an effort to improve the rate of adolescents and young adults receiving well care visits. This is an 18-month project targeting efforts to increase Iowa's outcomes for this measure (national goal rate is 80 percent). This is a new arena for the IDPH, as most efforts have been aimed at young children in the past. Two pilot projects, Clinic Pilot and Community Pilot have been implemented. IDPH is using tools developed by the University of Michigan for pre- and post-assessments for the Clinic Pilot. They are working in collaboration with the University of Iowa Public Policy Center to conduct focus groups for the Community Pilot. IDPH has also partnered with the Iowa High School Athletic Association to encourage well visits during annual sports physicals statewide. Suggested additional partnerships following this presentation included contacting school districts and utilizing IDPH's social media (Facebook, Twitter). Mary Sweeney from UHC also suggested the presentation be given during a weekly meeting held with the three MCO's quality directors.

Deb Johnson, DHS Bureau Chief, gave a high level overview of Medicaid modernization and the **hawk-i** Program. DHS has been working with CMS and the MCOs regarding the move to managed care as of March 1, 2016. Three key areas of focus (as recommended by CMS) include communication, network adequacy, and care coordination. The **hawk-i** Program will be included in the MCO transition. Details of this transition are still being discussed and the role of the **hawk-i** CAC is still being defined.

There were no other topics discussed. The next scheduled meeting of this committee is April 21, 2016.
