Dear Child Care Provider,

This letter is in regards to the February 20, 2015 compliance check of your Level C-1, Registered Child Development Home. Iowa Code Chapter 237A and 441 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 110, describes specific requirements that must be met by a Registered Child Development Home. The following areas were out of compliance at the time of my visit:

110.5(2) A provider file is maintained and contains:

110.5(2)a A physician's signed statement of health and immunization status on the provider and all members of the household who may be present when children are in the home. Statements must be obtained at the time of initial registration and updated every two years.

You reported that you don't have a current physical on file but do have an appointment in March to get this updated. Please use the new forms provided to you on pages 24 and 25 of the packet given to you at the time of the spot check.

110.5(2)b During the second year of registration and each succeeding year, twelve hours of approved training. At least six hours shall be in a group setting. If the provider has documentation of completing the ChildNet, PITC, or Beyond Business Basics series, these hours may be used to fulfill two year's training requirements, not including first aid and mandatory reporter training. A specific training shall not be used to meet requirements more than one time every five years.

You currently appear to have approximately 14 hours of training completed. You reported you are signed up for the remainder of the courses and have a plan to complete all required hours. If classes cancel or you are not able to attend for any reason, please contact Child Care Resource and Referral at 515-246-3560. There are also some online courses available on page 11 of the packet provided.

110.5(8) Children's Files

110.5(8)d For infants and preschoolers: An admission physical examination, on the first day of attendance, including past health history, status of present health, allergies and restrictive conditions, and recommendations for continued care when necessary. The date of the exam is not more than 12 months before the child's first day of attendance.

Please go through all your childrne's files to ensure that all physicals are current; each child needs an updated physical once a year in addition to an immunization record.

110.5(8)e For infants and preschoolers: A statement of health signed by a physician submitted annually.

110.5(8)e For school aged children: An annual statement of health condition signed by the parent or legal guardian, annually from date of admission physical.

Please request from parents. You can provide your parents with page 4 of the packet provided to assist in obtaining required documentation.

Non-compliance with any of the mandated regulatory requirements listed above may lead to the cancellation or revocation of your Child Development Home Registration. **Please take whatever steps are necessary to completely address each of the violations noted above. It is essential you correct all above-mentioned violations within the next 45 days.**

Based on the items out of compliance listed above, you will be required to have a recheck or follow up visit to your home. This visit will occur after the 45 day time period has elapsed.

x Based on the items out of compliance listed above, a recheck or follow up visit to your home is **NOT** necessary. However, it is essential you provide documentation to the Department that certifies you have corrected each of the identified regulatory violations and are now in complete compliance with all Departmental regulatory mandates. **Please check mark each of the boxes listed above when the necessary corrections have been completed. By doing so, you certify that you have completed all of the mandated regulatory requirements contained within each identified section.**

I certify that I have taken all of the steps necessary to correct each of the identified violations noted above and am now in complete compliance with all of the Departmental mandated regulatory rules.
