Dear Ms Strahom,

This letter is in regards to the March 10, 2014 compliance check of your Category B, Registered Child Development Home. Iowa Code Chapter 237A and 441 Iowa Administrative Code, Chapter 110, describes specific requirements that must be met by a Registered Child Development Home. The following areas were out of compliance at the time of my visit:

110.5(2) A provider file is maintained and contains:

110.5(2)a A physician's signed statement of health and immunization status on the provider and all members of the household who may be present when children are in the home. Statements must be obtained at the time of initial registration and updated every two years.

Ensure all household members and assistant/substitutes have current documentation in their personal files of a current physical. Please use the new forms on pages 33 and 34 of the packet that was provided during the spot check for family members that have not already had a physical in the past two years. School physicals are acceptable for your own school age children.

110.5(2)b Certification by an approved trainer/organization in infant and child first-aid that includes mouth-to-mouth resuscitation. Certification will be maintained throughout period of registration. If they are unable to locate first aid training that includes mouth-to-mouth resuscitation, they must complete both a first aid course and CPR.

Certification was slightly expired. Please schedule a renewal class as soon as possible. If you need assistance locating a class contact Child Care Resource and Referral at 1-800-722-7619.

Non-compliance with any of the mandated regulatory requirements listed above may lead to the cancellation or revocation of your Child Development Home Registration. **Please take whatever steps are necessary to completely address each of the violations noted above. It is essential you correct all above-mentioned violations on or before April 11, 2014.**

Based on the items out of compliance listed above, you will be required to have a re-check or follow-up visit to your home. This visit will occur on or after _____.

Based on the items out of compliance listed above, a re-check or follow-up visit to your home is not necessary. However, it is essential you come into complete compliance with all Departmental
