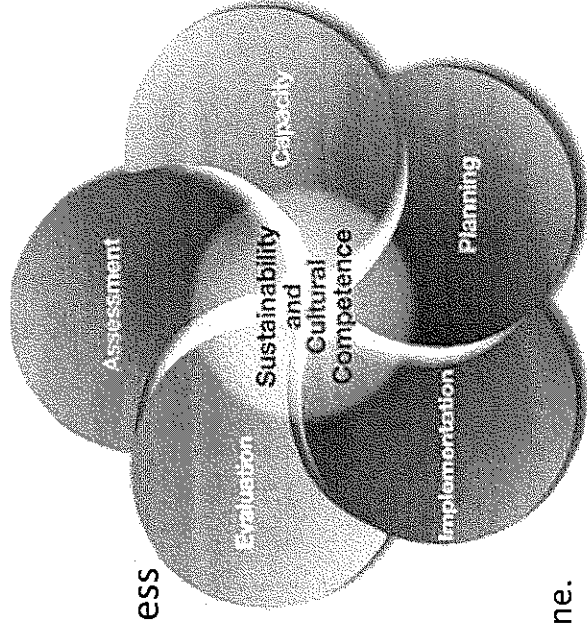
Assessment

- Tri-Ethnic Center Community Readiness Model
- Match an intervention to the community's level of readiness
- 6 dimensions

- Community efforts
- Community knowledge of efforts
- Leadership
- Community climate
- Community knowledge about the issue
- Resources related to the issue

• 9 Stages

1. No Awareness-May not be an issue or not recognized as one.
2. Denial/Resistance-Some recognize as concern, but don't see it occurring locally.
3. Vague Awareness-Local concern, but no immediacy to do anything.
4. Preplanning-Something must be done. Group may be addressing it, but efforts not focused or detailed.
5. Preparation-Active leaders begin planning. Community offers modest support of efforts.
6. Initiation-Enough information to justify efforts. Activities underway.
7. Stabilization-Activities supported by decision makers. Staff trained/experienced.
8. Confirmation/Expansion-Efforts in place. Community supports expansion. Local data regularly obtained.
9. High Level of Community Ownership-Detailed knowledge exists about prevalence, causes, consequences. Effective evaluation guides new directions. Model applied to other issues.
